Together they will reflect on food justice work, accomplishments and future goals in Chicago, Cook County and across the state of Illinois.

OUR HISTORY

CFPAC was formed in 2002 as a result of an Illinois Food Summit organized by the Chicago Community Trust. The effort began with a series of open meetings held on Chicago's Southside that utilized consensus to establish a mission and organizational operating structure. CFPAC officially became a 501(c)3 in 2011 and hired its first full-time staff member in 2017.

OUR MISSION

CFPAC co-develops, facilitates, advocates for, and supports implementation of policies that advance food justice and food sovereignty in Chicago and across the region.

OUR VISION

CFPAC envisions a food system where all Chicagoans, regardless of race, class, gender, and/or social identity, have the right to healthy and culturally-appropriate food produced through community-driven, ecologically regenerative, and economically viable processes. The Council recognizes the history and modern maintenance of structural racism in Chicago and across the country that have led to massive inequities in land access, food business ownership, food security, and political power along lines of racial identity. CFPAC works to address these inequities and dismantle racist structures in the food system by building local political power, supporting frontline workers throughout the food system, and facilitating Black/Brown partnerships and understanding.







GOOD FOOD PURCHASING PROGRAM

Led by the Chicago Department of Public Health, Cook County Department of Public Health, and the Chicago Food Policy Action Council, the Good Food Purchasing Initiative of Metro Chicago (GFPI) works to ensure that institutional food purchasing advances an equitable, healthy, fair, local, humane, and sustainable food system while creating good food access for all.

PRODUCTIVE LANDSCAPES

The Productive Landscapes Project is a multilateral effort to map, assess and transform underutilized public lands into productive multipurpose landscapes that solve multiple issues and create opportunities for local healthy food production, community engagement, economic & resource development, and environmental improvement.

FOOD RESEARCH

The Midwest Consortium for Equity, Research, and Food Justice (M-CERF) is a group of university, government, and community-based researchers that collaborate with communities in Chicago's foodshed to answer questions related to food equity and support transitions to more equitable food system.

CFJ RHIZOME NETWORK

Since 2020, CFPAC has convened over 500 organizations, food system leaders, urban farmers, and stakeholders called The ChicagoFood Justice Rhizome Network. These focused working groups are aimed to strengthen Chicago's food shed and address the systemic food inequity causes. The Rhizome Network is open to the public and aims to foster connections and equip advocates with the tools and resources to further their work.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

The food justice and advocacy world is continuously growing and expanding, and CFPAC is priming youth folks to step up to new challenges! Each year CFPAC hires Summer Interns to support our programs, hires 9 contracted employees to support the planning and execution of the Annual Chicago Food Justice Summit, and hosts six virtual job fairs per year. Through inviting new folks into our planning and programs, CFPAC serves as a career launch pad for food justice advocates to find full time employment with CFPAC's partners.

BUYER - SUPPLIER MIXERS

The Chicago Food Policy Action Council organized three days of workshops and networking events aimed at supporting smal food businesses. Businesses owners interested in selling buying local food were able to meet with food producers ready to sell their product at the wholesale level.
